COMMITTEE 1: AFRICAN UNION (AU)

TOPIC: THE SITUATION IN MALI

Taking into account the on-going developments in Mali, and the UN backed, African-led International Support Mission to Mali (AFISMA), delegates are tasked with finding a possible strategy to restore peace. Delegates must find ways to promote a stable political and economic situation while dealing with al-Qaeda presence in the area. Delegates will also need to address the imploding humanitarian issues in Mali and how the root causes of instability can be addressed in a sustainable way to avoid future conflict.

COMMITTEE 2: G20 TOPIC: FOOD SECURITY

In the lead up to this year's G20 meeting in St. Petersburg, Russia, this special session of the Group of Twenty (G20) will look at issues around global food security. Delegates of this session will have to consider issues such as the global availability, accessibility and distribution of food across all levels of society. Food security is not an isolated topic and to fully understand its implications for the world, delegates will need to look at how it is affected by other issues such as climate change, environmental degradation and conflict. Conversely, delegates will also need to look at how food (in) security impacts nutrition, health and overall human security.

COMMITTEE 3: UNITED NATIONS OFFICE FOR OUTER SPACE AFFAIRS (UNOOSA) TOPIC: PEACEFUL USES FOR OUTER SPACE

With the development of the Square Kilometre Array (SKA) in South Africa, many of us have started to think about the universe beyond our planet. While the SKA will focus more on deep space research, numerous issues that deal with space issues closer to earth are of great interest to the United Nations and its member states.

Outer space is used for developing science and technology, commercial purposes, communications and even tourism. Possible future arms races and weaponization of space, as well as the increasing amount of space debris pose serious threats to these more 'peaceful' uses of outer space. Delegates of this committee will need to come together to discuss ways to encourage states to develop peaceful uses for outer space, and to potentially create a treaty to ban or restrict certain space related actions.
